TOPICS DISCUSSED AT HCWA APRIL MEETING

The Flood Damage Report forms provided by DEP were reviewed & explained to the attendees at the April meeting. Some street assignments were made but more volunteers are needed, especially in the Exeter Park area. All that is required is a few hours of your time to go door-to-door, ask the residents about any flood damage that has occurred to their property and fill out the DEP form for them. The data will be used by DEP and HCWA to prioritize our flood protection project and increase the chances for grant funding.

The HCWA Spring Cleanup Project is set for Saturday, May 15th from 9am to 12 noon. The area to be addressed is the section of the LCRA Railroad (the upper RR) from West 6th Street in West Wyoming to Schooley Avenue in Exeter. The railroad company has agreed to provide a pushcart to assist in the garbage removal, but volunteers and donations of food, bug spray and other miscellaneous items are still needed.

A Senatorial Certificate of Recognition from Senator Musto will be presented to each volunteer. This document is a nice addition to a
